NJ COALITION ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Chris Sagona attends NJ Coalition meetings on behalf of LWVNV and in that capacity serves as founding Steering Committee Member and Policy Co-Chair. The Policy Committee their US Representatives to urge support of is currently working on policy stances, similar to League's Impact on Issues.

The Coalition recently released a statement on House of Representatives bill HR1865 and Senate bill1693. This legislation:

- ◆ Supports prosecution of companies that facilitate trafficking via web sites
- ♦ Guarantees victims right to speak up against traffickers

 Disables web sites from hiding behind the guise of free speech.

League members are encouraged to call this bipartisan bill. The bill has received strong push back from Google, and other tech groups, who say that it infringes on their free speech rights. Contact Chris to learn more about this or if you'd like to get involved with this topic.

UNITED NATIONS * LWV of THE US * OBSERVERS

The League of Women Voters of the United and Tajikistan. States Observers, Rosalee Keetch (Observer) and Chris Sagona, Judy Schachter, Suzanne Stassjevich (Observer Alternates) held their Annual Strategy Meeting on June 23 in NYC.

The meeting reviewed last year's events, partnerships, accomplishments, etc., and made plans for next year. Partners included: The International Labor Organization, UN Commis-

sion on the Status of Women, UN Department of Public Information, Working Group on Girls (WGG, a group the LWVUS-UN started at the UN and that now has about 80 participating organizations), US State Department, US Justice Department, the Special Representative to the UN Sec General to Prevent Violence Against Children, UN Women, and UNICEF. Permanent Missions to the UN who we've partnered with include: the USA, Ukraine, Germany, Bosni-Herzegovina, China, Japan, Brazil ing webtv.un.org

Chris reports that several women's and girls' empowerment events and talks on the UN and the Sustainable Development Goals were held. The group also provided statements to the UN with their stance on issues including the Chibok girls, with a statement to the head of Nigeria, pressing for their release.

Each Spring, Leagues are invited to come to NYC to participate in the two weeks of events of the UN Commission on the Status of Women. This year LWVNV Member and now Board Member Cathy Mick attended CSW, as well as Chris Sagona and Ridgewood League's Patty Infantino. Patty made a presentation to Ridgewood about the League's role in the UN and CSW, and the events she attended. Cathy Mick did similarly for LWVNV.

Members of local Leagues are able to watch live feeds or archived video of United Nations events at any time on any day by visit-



IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT VOTING:

To qualify for voting, citizens must be registered at least 21 days before the election and be 18 years of age by the election. You may register to vote if you are 17 years old but cannot vote until you are 18. You *may* declare a party affiliation but are not required to do so until you want to vote in a primary. Registration is permanent unless you change your name or address, but changes in party designation are permitted annually. State law requires that sample ballots be mailed to all registered voters one week before each election. Register in person with the town clerk or the county elections office.
