# COMMEMORATING SUFFRAGISTS SOJOURNER TRUTH AND ROSALIE GARDINER JONES

In honor of the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Women's Right to Vote in New York State (Nov 1917), Governor Andrew Cuomo and Lieutenant Governor Kathy Hochul announced the dedication and building of two statues commemorating suffragists Sojourner Truth and Rosalie Gardiner Jones in November.


The statue of Sojourner Truth will be sited on the Empire State Trail in Ulster County, where she was born. Truth was born into slavery circa 1797, sold three times, and ultimately escaped to freedom in 1826. She went on to become a noted abolitionist and women's rights advocate until her death in 1883.

The statue of Rosalie Gardiner Jones will be built in Cold Spring Harbor State Park on Long Island. Known as "General Jones," she

was born and lived in Cold Spring Harbor and was respected for leading suffrage "pilgrims" on marches from New York City to Albany and Washington, DC in support of women's suffrage.

The State will issue a call for submissions to select the designs of each statue. There are currently 25 statues on New York State property, including two women: Dr. Mary Walker, a civil war surgeon in Oswego and frontierswoman Mary Jemison in Letchworth State Park. With the addition of the new statues of Truth and Jones, the total number of statues of women on New York State property will double to four.

Women's suffrage passed on November 6, 1917 in New York, three years before the 19th amendment granting the vote to women.



#### **FREEDOM**

After she became free in 1827, she renamed herself Sojourner Truth.

She became an outspoken advocate of blacks' rights and women's rights.

Sojourner gave her famous "Ain't I a Women?" speech at the 1851 Women's Rights Convention.
