- 32 local Leagues were represented including three newest: Greater New Brunswick Area, Atlantic County, and Warren and West Morris Counties.
- Webinars about the budget, program and changes to bylaws, were provided to attendees in advance allowing for an efficient adoption process.
- The Making Democracy Work award candidates were seriously inspirational.
- Guest speakers Ari Berman (Keynote), an award-winning journalist and author, who spoke about voting rights, Maggie Bush, LWV-U.S., who spoke about phone banking to be piloted in NJ's upcoming election

to increase voter turnout, and Yvette Murry, a master trainer, who spoke about advancing the League's diversity, equity, and inclusion goals all gave attendees lots to think about.

A number of awards were presented to a variety of Leagues. Included were Leagues who had the largest percentage growth in membership. These ranged from growing 58% to 115% in one year!! Great work.

Annual Dinner Meeting

Members and guests are invited to attend the Northern Valley League of Women Voter's 73rd Annual Meeting on Tuesday, June 11, at **5:30 PM**, at Palmer's Crossing at the Clinton

Inn, in Tenafly. Our guest speaker is Associate Professor of American Studies, John Gronbeck-Tedesco, PhD. Dr. Gronbeck-Tedesco has authored books and articles about his research interests in U.S. & Latin American politics as well as U.S. culture in the 20th century. He is working on a book about Cuban refugees and teaches at Ramapo College of New Jersey.

Dr. Gronbeck-Tedesco will speak about immigration in America. He will explain how our current immigration policy came to be and will describe reforms that could improve it.



ELECTION SEASON IS UNDER WAY...

Elections for all 80 seats in the NJ General Assembly will take place with a Primary Election on June 4th and in the General Election on November 5. NJ is one of seven state legislative chambers holding elections in 2019.

A primary is an election that allows members of a political party to choose a candidate to represent them in an upcoming election. NJ is a closed primary state. This means that only those voters who are registered for a party may vote in the election. Unaffiliated voters can register with a political party up to and including Primary Election Day. You may file a <u>Party Affiliation Declaration Form</u> with the Commissioner of Registration/Superintendent of Elections for your county by mail, 55 days before the election or in person. This form is also available in <u>Spanish or Korean</u>.

Northern Valley residents are served by state Legislative Districts 37 and 39. The filing deadline for candidates was April 1, 2019. Towns in these districts and candidates are as follows:

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 39 includes towns of: Closter, Demarest, Dumont, Emerson, Harrington Park, Haworth, Hillsdale, Mahwah, Montvale, Norwood, Oakland, Old Tappan, Park Ridge, Ramsey, River Vale, Saddle River, Upper Saddle River, Washington, Westwood, Woodcliff Lake.

Candidates: Assembly: Robert Auth * (R), Holly Schepisi * (R),

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 37 includes the towns of: Alpine, Bogota, Cresskill, Englewood, Englewood Cliffs, Fort Lee, Hackensack, Leonia, Northvale, Palisades Park, Rockleigh, Teaneck, Tenafly in Bergen County and Bloomingdale, Ringwood, and Wanaque in Passaic County Candidates: Angela Hendricks (R), Gino Tesssaro (R), Valerie Vainieri Huttle * (D), and Gordon M. Johnson * (D) * incumbent

Vote by Mail ballots are available for any registered voter for any election. You do not need a reason to request a ballot, but you must complete an <u>application</u>. These applications are available in <u>Spanish and Korean</u>. To receive your ballot by mail, the application must be received by the County Clerk seven days prior to the election. A voter may also apply in person to the County Clerk until 3:00 p.m., the day before the election.

You can register to vote if you are a U.S. citizen, 17 years old (with the understanding you may not vote before your 18th birthday), have been a resident of your NJ county 30 days before the elections, and you are not currently serving a sentence, probation or parole for a felony conviction. Remember to re-register to vote if you change your name, address, or complete your sentence, probation or parole! <u>Voter Registration application here.</u> These applications are also available in <u>Spanish and Korean</u>.
