


CELEBRATING SUFFRAGE!











This issue of the newsletter provides the handout, created for the LWVNV's February 10th event, commemorating the 19th amendment to the U.S. Constitution which gave women the right to vote. It identifies a few leaders of the long struggle and highlighted milestones in the 72-year journey to get the vote. Here are a few highlights from the event:

Two performances of "Reclaiming Our Voice: New Jersey's Central Role in the Fight for Women's Suffrage" were given by living history presenter, Carol Simon Levin. One was for @ 200 Leonia Public School history students, grades 8-12. The second was for a crowd of @ 170 which drew newcomers, representatives from our nine partner organizations, LWVNV members, and attendees from Leonia and area towns.

Carol depicted America's history in an interesting and substantive way, enlivened with suffrage sashes provided to LWVNV hosts.

Cathie Mick, Vicki Sidrow, Shannon Currie, and Nike Bach informed attendees about LWV activities in which they could become involved. These included: Voters Service, Legislative Advocacy, 2020 Census, and Fair Districts NI

Two commendations were received. One was from Bergen County Executive **James Tedesco III**. The second was from the Bergen County Freeholders. They were presented by **Cynthia Forster**, Bergen County Dept of Parks, Division of Cultural & Historical Affairs.

2020 CENSUS: 10 QUESTIONS, 10 MINUTES, 10 YEARS



That's how **Shannon Currie**, LWVNV member and 2020 Census Coordinator, introduced the 2020 Census at the February 10th event. The U.S. Constitution requires that the U.S. Census Bureau take a *count* — *a census* — of America's population *every decade*. This includes all 50 states and the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and the Island Areas. It is not limited to voters — as it includes children and noncitizens. It included women before women could vote, slaves before they were emancipated, immigrants, etc.! The first census was conducted in 1790.

In March, residents will receive a notice to complete the 10 census questions online. Completing it is mandatory and vital to our community and country. If residents haven't responded by May, Census Takers will start knocking on doors of households who didn't respond. The deadline to respond is July 31.

The census provides vital information for you and your community:

• It determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress
It is used to redraw district boundaries.
(Redistricting counts will be sent to states by March 31, 2021.)

- Each year, \$675 billion is distributed to communities, nationwide, for roads, schools, emergency services, and more.
- Businesses use census data to determine where to open places of business.

25 percent of New Jerseyans didn't respond to the last census, in 1990. NJ lost one Congressional seat.

Under Title 13 of the U.S. Code, the Census Bureau cannot release any identifiable information about individuals, households, or businesses, even to law enforcement agencies. Answers can only be used to produce statistics—they cannot be used against a responder in any way. All responses to U.S. Census Bureau must be kept completely confidential.

National, state, and local leagues are <u>undertaking activities and actions</u> to help assure a complete count of the U.S. population. The League can assist Complete Count Committees, conduct informational workshops, and has partnered with libraries to help provide access to computers. *If* you are interested in learning more or in helping with this effort, please contact Shannon at scurrie@bsgco.com

2020cernsus.gov Important Dates:

In mid-March, homes across the country will begin receiving invitations to complete the 2020 Census. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail.

LWVUS UN Observers are preparing for the 64th meeting of the Commission on the Status of

Women at the United Nations in New York on March 9-20, 2020. The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) is the principal global intergovernmental body exclusively devoted to promoting women's rights, documenting the reality of women's lives throughout the world, and shaping global standards on gender equality and the empowerment of women. There are about 20 League delegates who will attend a minimum of 4-5 days of CSW and will participate in all varieties of sessions including commission meetings

and side events.

As this year marks the 25th anniversary of the Beijing platform, meetings, events, discussions will center on how close women have come to reaching and not reaching goals set in Beijing.
